CHORAL EVENSONG

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We welcome you to St Mary's and to this service. Worship has been offered to God daily in this church for hundreds of years.

Evensong is the distinctive service of Evening Prayer used by churches of the Anglican Communion. It includes elements from the Medieval Latin offices of Vespers and Compline, and has been largely unchanged since the first English Prayer Book of 1549.

The service opens with an invitation to worship, a Confession and Absolution, and the Lord's Prayer. After versicles and responses sung by the Priest and Choir, the roots of the Christian faith in the Old Testament are acknowledged by the singing of a Psalm and the reading of the first lesson from the Old Testament. The Choir than sings the Magnificat, the song of the Virgin Mary when she received the promise of the birth of Jesus. The second esson is from the New Testament, to which the Choir responds by singing Nunc Dimittis, the song of Simeon when he saw the child Jesus and recognised in him the fulfilment of the promise to Israel. After an affirmation of faith in the Creed, there are further sung prayers and an Anthem. This completes the office of Evensong; the service continues with a sermon, prayers of intercession and hymns.

THE COLLECTS

The priest says the first two collects. All say the third collect:

Lighten our darkness, we beseech thee, O Lord, and by thy great mercy defend us from all perils and dangers of this night; for the love of thy only Son, our Saviour, Jesus Christ, Amen.

The Congregation sits for **THE ANTHEM**, sung by the Choir

ORDER OF SERVICE

All stand as the Choir and Clergy enter.

The Priest says **THE INTRODUCTION**. All kneel and say together

A GENERAL CONFESSION:

Almighty and most merciful Father, we have erred, and strayed from thy ways like lost sheep. We have followed too much the devices and desires of our own hearts. We have offended against thy holy laws. We have left undone those things which we ought to have done; and we have done those things which we ought not to have done; and there is no health in us. But thou, O Lord, have mercy upon us, miserable offenders. Spare thou them, O God, which confess their faults. Restore thou them that are penitent; according to thy promises declared unto mankind in Christ Jesu our Lord. And grant, O most merciful Father, for his sake, that we may hereafter live a godly, righteous, and sober life, to the glory of thy holy name. Amen.

The Priest stands and says THE ABSOLUTION

And his mercy is on them that fear him:

throughout all generations.

He hath shewed strength with his arm:

All sit for **THE SECOND LESSON**, from the New Testament.

All sit for NUNC DIMITTIS, sung by the Choir.

Lord, now lettest thou thy servant depart in peace: according to thy word.

For mine eyes have seen: thy salvation;

Which thou hast prepared: before the face of all people;

To be a light to lighten the Gentiles: and to be the glory of thy

people Israel.

All stand for the **GLORIA**.

Glory be to the Father, and to the Son:

And ever shall be: world without end. Amen.

All face the Altar and say together

THE APOSTLES' CREED

I believe in God the Father almighty,

maker of heaven and earth:

And in Jesus Christ his only Son our Lord,

suffered under Pontius Pilate,

was crucified, dead and buried.

He descended into hell;

the third day he rose again from the dead;
