- 3. Lives again our victorious King; Where, O death, is now thy sting? Dying once, he all doth save; Where thy victory, O grave?

- 4. Soar we now where Christ has led, Following our exalted Head; Made like him, like him we rise, Ours the cross, the grave, the skies.
- 5. Hail the Lord of earth and heaven! Praise to thee by both be given: Thee we greet triumphant now; Hail, the Resurrection thou!

The Lord is here: Alleluia! His Spirit is with us. Alleluia!

We have come together as the family of God in this community. And especially we thank you, Heavenly Father, for your family, the Church; and for your love in sending us your Son Jesus who brings us his peace wherever we may be. Help us to pray to you in faith, to sing your praise with gratitude, and to listen to your word with eagerness; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**.
