### **REFLECTIONS**

The Gospel today shows us three things about Peter.
First - He often acted on impulse, without thinking what he was doing - without fully facing the situation and without counting the cost. Peter's trouble was that, he was ruled by his heart, and although he sometimes failed, his heart was always in the right place and the instinct of his heart was always one of love.
Second - Because Peter acted on impulse he often failed and came to grief. Jesus always tried to make people see how difficult it was to follow him before they set out on the Christian way. A great deal of Christian failure is due to acting without first counting the cost.

Third - Peter never totally failed, because in his moment of failure he turned to Jesus. The wonderful thing about Peter is that every time he fell, he got up again; and even his failures brought him closer to Jesus. It is true that, a saint is not a person who never falls; a saint is a person who gets up and goes on again every time he falls. Peter's failures only made him love Jesus all the more and discover wherever Jesus is the wildest storm will always become a 'calm'.

Bishop Francis had often seen a farm servant, near where he lived, going across the farmyard to draw water from the well; before she lifted the full bucket, the girl always put a piece of wood into it. One day he went up to the girl and asked her, "Why do you do that?" She looked surprised and answered, as if it were a matter of course, "Why? It keeps the water from spilling, keeps it steady!" Writing to a friend later the bishop told this story and then added: "So when your heart is distressed and agitated, put the Cross into the centre of your heart, to keep it steady!" (99)

All of us experience times of storm and stress and need to turn to Jesus, acknowledging his presence with us and the love which flows from his Cross, so that we may have his peace, his serenity and his calm.

# Ninth Sunday after Trinity 9th August 2020

#### Collect

Almighty God, who sent your Holy Spirit to be the life and light of your Church: open our hearts to the riches of your grace, that we may bring forth the fruit of the Spirit in love and joy and peace; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

#### First Reading: Romans 10.5-15

Moses writes concerning the righteousness that comes from the law, that 'the person who does these things will live by them.' But the righteousness that comes from faith says, 'Do not say in your heart, "Who will ascend into heaven?" (that is, to bring Christ down) 'or "Who will descend into the abyss?" (that is, to bring Christ up from the dead). But what does it say? 'The word is near you, on your lips and in your heart' (that is, the word of faith that we proclaim); because if you confess with your lips that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For one believes with the heart and so is justified, and one confesses with the mouth and so is saved. The scripture says, 'No one who believes in him will be put to shame.' For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek; the same Lord is Lord of all and is generous to all who call on him. For, 'Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved.' But how are they to call on one in whom they have not believed? And how are they to believe in one of whom they have never heard? And how are they to hear without someone to proclaim him? And how are they to proclaim him unless they are sent? As it is written, 'How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!'

# Gospel: Matthew 14.22-33

Immediately after feeding the crowd with the five loaves and two fish, Jesus made the disciples get into the boat and go on ahead to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds. And after he had dismissed the crowds, he went up the mountain by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone, but by this time the boat, battered by the waves, was far from the land, for the wind was against them. And early in the morning he came walking towards them on the lake. But when the disciples saw him walking on the lake, they were terrified, saying, 'It is a ghost!' And they cried out in fear. But immediately Jesus spoke to them and said, 'Take heart, it is I; do not be afraid.' Peter answered him, 'Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water.' He said, 'Come.' So Peter got out of the boat, started walking on the water, and came towards Jesus. But when he noticed the strong wind, he became frightened, and beginning to sink, he cried out, 'Lord, save me!' Jesus immediately reached out his hand and caught him, saying to him, 'You of little faith, why did you doubt?' When they got into the boat, the wind ceased. And those in the boat worshipped him, saying, 'Truly you are the Son of God.'

Dear Friends

I wonder if you like me enjoy doing puzzles? Personally I enjoy most the 'Jigsaw' variety. Putting the pieces in and seeing the picture develop is very rewarding as you can begin to understand what it will be like when finished.

Sometimes working one piece at a time is necessary in order to understand what the artist is trying to convey. The same can apply to trying to understand a passage from scripture. In order to be able to understand the full picture it is often necessary to think about a verse at a time. Some of Paul's letters are like that and time is necessary.

Being still and quiet without rushing can help us understand what is being said. We need to recognise that just saying the words is not enough, we need to really believe them in our hearts and practice them in our lives. When we believe and practice in our lives that 'Jesus was raised from the dead' we will be saved.

The same fact applies no matter which religious group we may belong to because, 'Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved'.

Having got to this position it is then necessary to go out and let others know either by speaking the words or just putting them into practice in our daily lives. As Paul finishes 'How beautiful are the feet of those who bring good news!'.
