Today in our readings and prayers we hear the account of Jesus calming the storm: and telling his disciples not to fear, but to have faith. Let us too hold on to the certainty that God cares for us, however stormy the events around us. You might like to light a candle at home while you use this leaflet, symbolising Jesus as the Light of the World: and to say the prayers and readings out loud.

Introduction

4 O Trinity of love and pow'r,
 Our brethren shield in danger's hour.
 From rock and tempest, fire, and foe,
 Protect them whereso'er they go;
 And ever let there rise to Thee
 Glad hymns of praise from land and sea.
