This prayer sheet may be especially helpful for those praying at home during Coronavirus restrictions. It covers Sundays in June, with readings and suggested hymns for each week. The text of the readings is given in the Grapevine, which will be sent round each week. We hope that this sheet will continue to connect you to the rhythm of our worship together.

You might like to light a candle, symbolising Jesus as the Light of the World: and to say the prayers and readings out loud. Remember that even if you are by yourself at home, you are still part of God's Church, praying across the world. In the Church's year, we have now left the great festivals of Easter, Pentecost and Trinity and are in what is known as 'ordinary time', with green vestments and church hangings. Yet this year as never before we know that no time can be deemed 'ordinary'. As circumstances change, we bring to God our concerns for ourselves and our world, trusting that he holds us in his love.

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SUGGESTED HYMNS

Sunday 6 June (Trinity 1)

There's a wideness in God's mercy like the wideness of the sea; there's a kindness in his justice, which is more than liberty.

Sunday 20 June (Trinity 2)

All who would valiant be, 'gainst all disaster, let them in constancy follow their master.
