We did a lot of advertising and had hoped that we might attract 100 visitors, as it was we had well over 300 which was amazing. We had archive displays showing the Church Annual reports back to the late 1800's and many archive documents relating to the Friends. The Ladies of the Sewing Circle had a beautiful display of their kneelers and banner work over the years which proved to be very popular.

The Church was decorated with display banners, (made especially for the event) attached to the columns, plus the beautifully intricate banners used at different times in the Church hanging from the Rood Screen.

Our new Friends Noticeboard was in place and started it's task of informing the congregation and visitors of our ongoing work.

The event raised sufficient interest for us to enrol lots of new members, some are still trickling in which is great.

This will not become an annual event but we have purchased a display box for Canon Chris Bishop to continue to display his archives every first Sunday of the month. They are there all morning until the end of coffee time so do come along and see for yourselves.

Recent Projects completed

As mentioned above the new **Friends Noticeboard** is now in place and will give updated information throughout the year.

Future Projects

New Lighting Scheme. In the long term we are still holding funds to contribute to this huge project as soon as it commences. Preliminary discussions are taking place and are progressing well with a good team in place. I am sure you all agree that this is a much needed project to bring our lighting in the Church up to modern standards.

Ongoing Projects

Kneelers. Anyone can commission a kneeler to commemorate a loved one or an occasion and can choose a central design. We charge £40 per kneeler to cover the cost of the canvas and the wool. Work has commenced on a kneeler for the Friends so watch this space!

To that end we commissioned a new drip tray to be installed on the Easter Candle Holder which should greatly improve matters. The current Advent Candle has proved to be even more difficult and cumbersome to clean so that is being replaced with a new, easy clean compact stand which will come into use this year, we were pleased to be able to help with these two issues.

Cathedral Visits

This year's visits were firstly to the stunning **Southwark Cathedra**l on Tues 25th July and included a lunch which we all enjoyed together. The afternoon was free to explore everything that the area had to offer like The Golden Hinde, The Tate Modern, The Clink Prison Museum, The Globe Theatre and of course Borough Market; plenty to choose from.

On November 17th we visited **Norwich Cathedral**; it was a cold but dry day. We were greeted by 2 very knowledgeable guides . Norwich has the biggest collection of masonry Roof Bosses in the world telling stories of the Bible from Creation to the Last Judgement. Edith Cavell was buried there and there are some interesting displays about her life. After lunch together, we had free time to visit the Castle or the Museum or to start the Christmas shopping.

On 8th April we are off to **Rochester Cathedral**, Britains second largest Cathedral so we are in for a treat. We will be lunching together and then free time to explore the town. Rochester stands on the Medway and has a Norman Castle and connections with Charles Dickens, so lots to explore.

On 30th August we are off to **St Albans Cathedral** for a morning tour and then to Ware for lunch and a trip on the river in the afternoon, something relaxing. Book early !
